


Our mission: To create and strengthen a statewide network that catalyzes and supports communities to improve college and career readiness, access, and completion for all students








Introduction:

Food and housing insecurity on college campuses is a significant public health issue





Findings: food and housing insecurity on college campuses


	University Students	Community College Students
Food insecurity within the last 30 days:	36%	42-56%
Housing insecurity within the last year:	36%	46-51%
Homeless within the last year:	9%	12-14%





Basic life needs insecurity isn't limited to Pell grant recipients

Even among students <u>not</u> receiving the Pell Grant, food and housing insecurity persists:			
	2-year	4-year	
Food insecurity	35%	28%	
Housing insecurity	38%	31%	
Homeless	10%	7%













FUNDING BREAKDOWN





Destination Graduation Works

When Joyce came to Destination Graduation, she was on the verge of losing her affordable rental home. She had been out of work for two months and had just signed up for UBER and Lyft to catch up with her expenses. While with this new arrangement and child support she would have enough income to cover her basic expenses moving forward; there was no way she could catch up on time to avoid an eviction. Joyce was on her last semester to graduate and had excellent academic performance. Yet, this bump on the road brought her really close to homelessness despite her best efforts to find alternative employment. Destination Graduation covered Joyce's overdue rent, which allowed her to be stable and graduate in the Spring of 2018.





Destination Graduation in 2018

Outputs:

- 400+ students helped
- 113 students funded*
- \$72k distributed in emergency aid

Outcomes:

• 84 percent re-enrollment rate in Summer 2018. This represented a 15 percent increase when compared to all low-income students in Seminole State College of Florida.



Sustainability & Collaboration




After the pilot grant ended, The Seminole State College Foundation and Heart of Florida United Way explored their ability to contribute to the program and reach an agreement.
